Also a person is needed to change the work stations from the foam/PVC pipe wing stop to a piece of carpet.

- 7. Field clean-up took place Saturday, May 11. A good turn-out resulted in the chores of trimming, brush clearing and all mowing completed in the morning hours. A long discussion was had on the upkeep of the field in accordance to our agreement with Dow Chemical Company. Greater care needs to be taken in insuring that only the areas that we have mowed is under our rental agreement. If any member feels that there is additional areas need trimming, they are to contact a board member for approval. Failure to follow these guid lines will result in the lost of the flying field.
